

Airport/Parks and Recreation Monthly report- March 2022

Two solar powered cameras were installed at the Rusty Allen Airport to monitor the gas pump computer system. If you will recall, the cabinet that houses the computer was vandalized, so the camera is an effort to monitor more closely.

Staff is searching for a vendor to clean up and repaint the Static Fighter jet display, located at the entrance to the Rusty Allen Airport. As a part of our agreement with the National Museum of the USAF/MUC, we are to maintain the display.

Staff attended the first Lago Fest meeting and will be assisting the week before Lago Fest. There will be 3 Parks and Recreation staff members working the day of the event.

The Eagle Scout working at Sunset Park finished his project by building a bridge on the newly named Eagles Trail.

Staff met with CEI Engineering to discuss getting costs estimates for upcoming amenities for the park system. These amenities will be included in the Park Master plan.

Progress is being made at Sunset Park now that the restrooms have arrived. Public Works trenched the area for water and sewer. Connections for utilities will be made very soon.

Staff met with a LED lighting company to get estimates for lighting the fields at Sunset Park.

Pool repairs have started at the Municipal Pool, in hopes of having the pool open Memorial Day weekend.
