PUBLIC WORKS NEWS

Street Resurfacing Project, ROW Maintenance, Water Plant #3 and Utilities

- To utilize funds given to the City by CapMetro, Public Works has published RFP 23-03 to resurface the following six roads: High Drive, Henry, Paine, Sunset Strip, Cheyenne, and Paseo De Vaca. This is to complete the Street Resurfacing project from the previous fiscal year.
- Streets crews are busy cutting and clearing vegetation from City Right-of-Ways. They are also in the process of measuring and gathering data of the streets remaining to be rehabilitated from the 2019 Street Rehab Plan. This is an effort to update and re-prioritize the remaining streets based on changes to road conditions and increased development.
- As part of a grant funded project, a generator has been placed at Water Plant #3. A second plant shut down was scheduled for January 12th to complete the installation of all remaining electrical components.
- Utility crews are continuing to repair and replace old fire hydrants.
- The above actions will payoff in better roads, safer site lines in Right of Ways (ROWS), redundancy in Plant Operations, as well as a better and more reliable water distribution and wastewater collection systems.
- Last, but definitely not least, we had an employee who retired at the end of January after 20 years of hard work and dedication to the City. As the Public Works Director, I would like to publicly thank this employee for his service, and congratulate him on his retirement.

Be Ready for Winter Storms BEFORE They Happen

Make Sure Your Home is Ready

- Winterize your home with insulation, caulking, and weather stripping.
- Learn how to keep interior and exterior pipes from freezing.
- Clear rain gutters, repair roof leaks, check your roof to make sure it can handle the extra weight of the snow and ice, and cut away tree branches that could fall on a house or neighboring structure.
- Install and test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors with battery backups.
- Have your chimney or flue inspected each year.
- Consider buying alternative heating resources. All heaters that run on fuel (natural gas, kerosene, butane, oil) should be vented.
- When purchasing a space heater, look for one that has an automatic shut-off or tip-over switch. Place the heater on a level surface away from high-traffic areas and flammable items, such as curtains, bedding, or furniture. Never use an extension cord - plug your space heater directly into the electrical outlet.

Make Sure Your Vehicle is Ready

- Create an emergency supply kit for your vehicle. Include matches, a windshield scraper, jumper cables, a flashlight, warm clothes, blankets, bottled water, non-perishable snacks, and a bright cloth to tie to the antenna.
- Store a small broom and a small sack of sand in your vehicle for generating traction under wheels and a set of tire chains or traction mats.
- Winterize your vehicle before the winter storm season to decrease your chance of being stranded in cold weather.
- Have a mechanic check your battery, antifreeze, wipers and windshield washer fluid, lights, flashing hazard lights, heater, brakes, defroster and oil.
