Introduction

June was a great and busy month for all of the divisions within the Police Department! This month, we completed training and transitioned to our new Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) and Records Management System (RMS). This transition went very smoothly, and the new system is working well. There are some differences in how this new system records data compared to our old system, with the new system being much more accurate. As such, you can expect to see some deviations in statistical patterns in the data reported in our weekly and monthly reports compared to data from the previous system.

Also, during this month, Chief Boshears attended a virtual meeting with the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) Community Policing Committee. Chief Boshears is an active member of this committee, which works on important initiatives for the IACP. Chief Boshears and support K9 Ella also visited the library during their summer reading program to greet children and parents.

This month was marked by significant achievements in our staff's continuing education. Officers Arnold and Hernandez attended training to prepare them for their new roles as Field Training Officers with our department. Meanwhile, Detective Sergeant Allocca successfully completed the second of three modules of the Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas' Leadership Command College. His dedication to furthering his knowledge and skills is commendable, and we look forward to his completion of the final module in September.

This month, we are thrilled to announce that Detective Sergeant David Wilson has successfully completed the Law Enforcement Command Officer Program (LECOP) from the Texas Police Chief's Association and was honored with the LECOP Award. This comprehensive program, consisting of 10 continuing education courses, covers a wide range of law enforcement management and leadership topics. Sergeant Wilson's achievement is a testament to his dedication to our department and community; we are immensely proud of him.

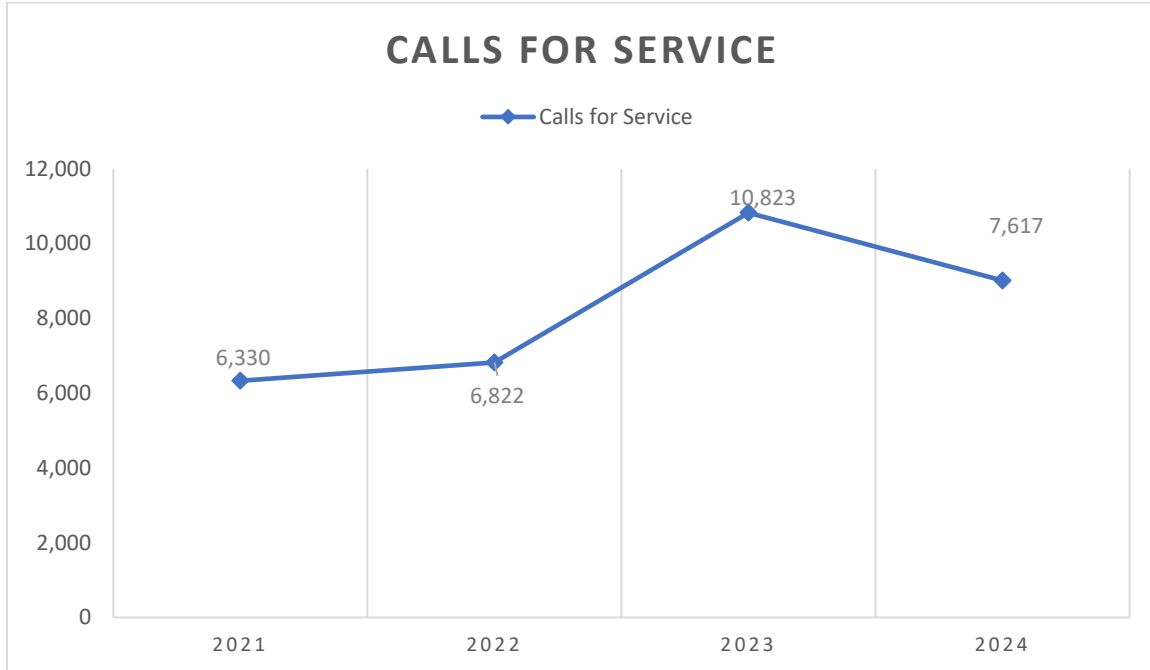

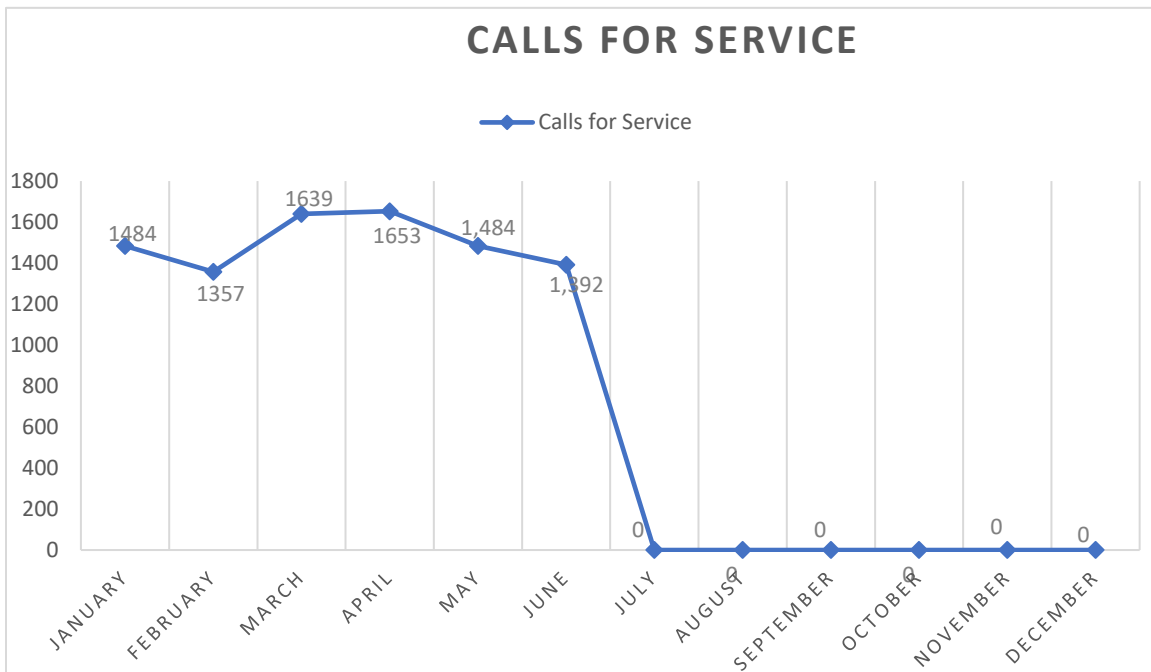

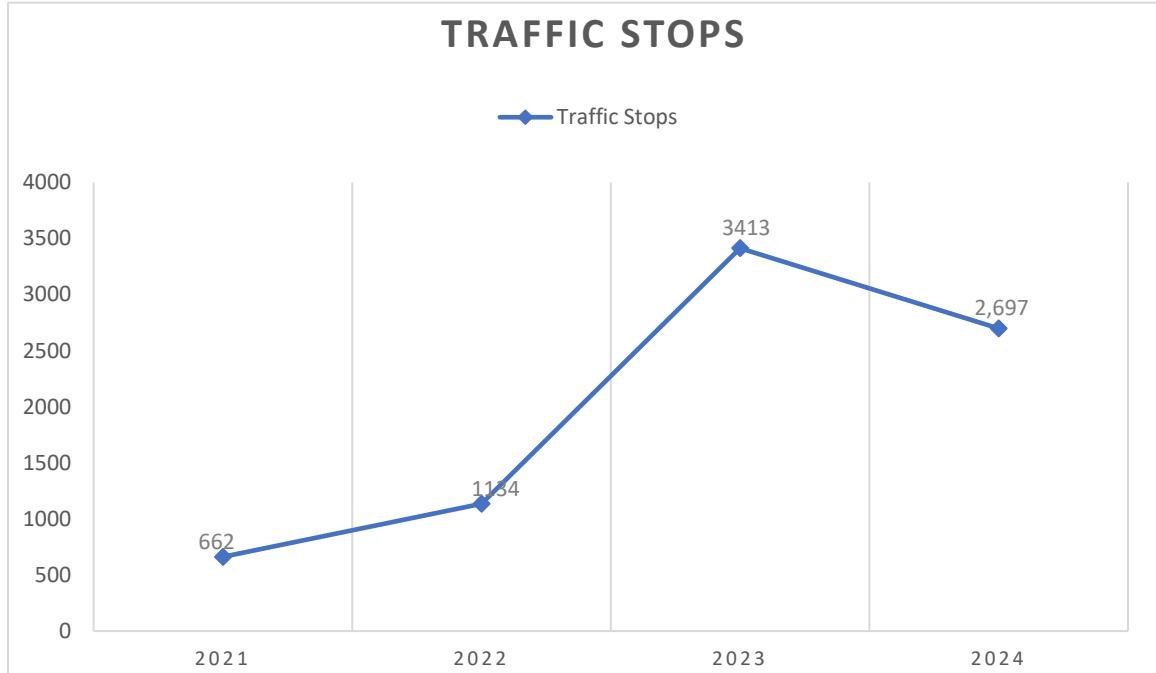
Calls for Service – Historical and Year-to-Date



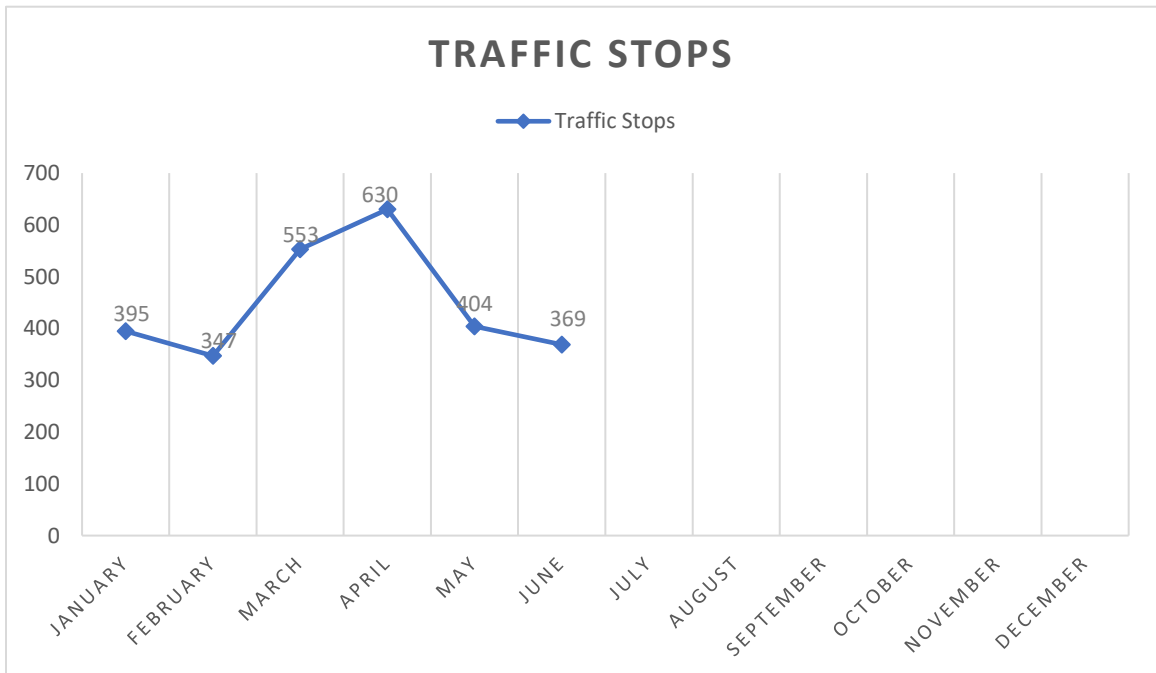
Calls for Service – 2024 by Month

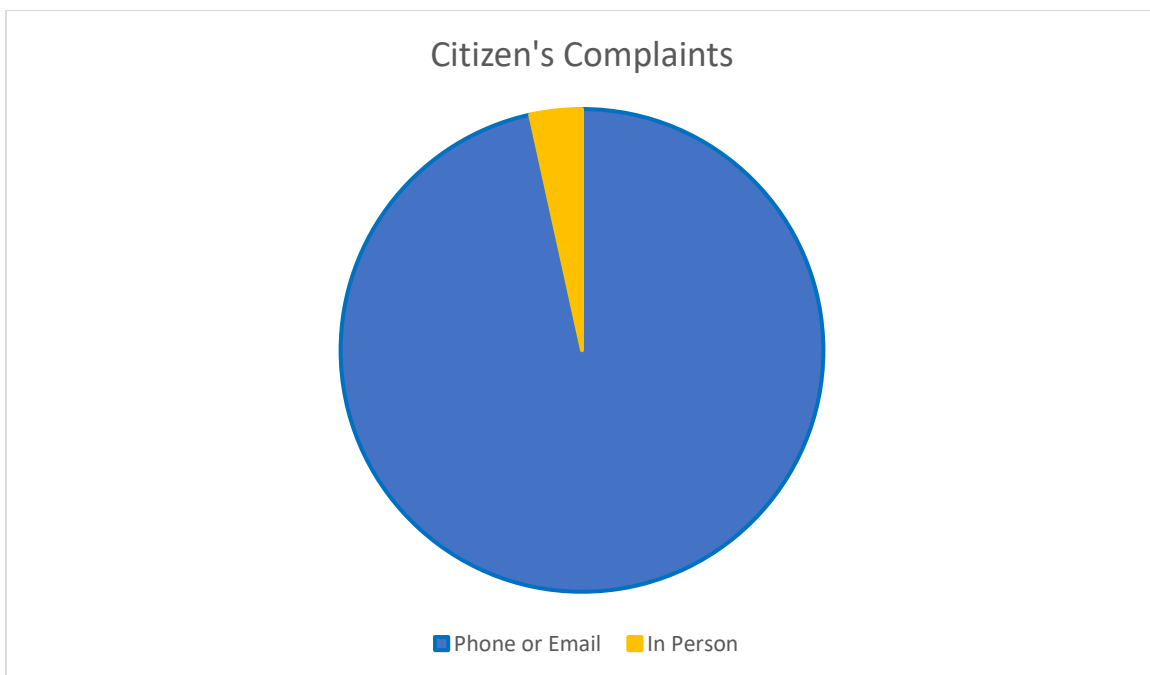
Summary

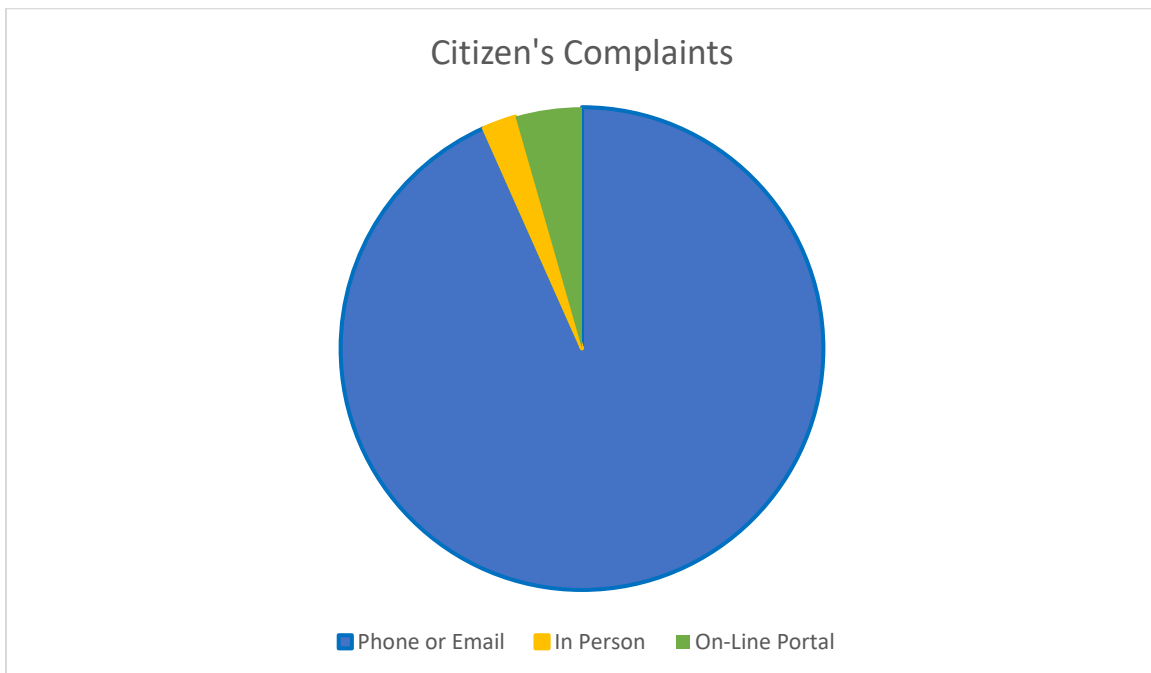
Summary
