4. Map data is from the Lago Vista Police Department – Dispatch Division.




Introduction

In July, the Police Department had a productive month. Our team played a crucial role in ensuring the safety and success of the City's 4th of July Fireworks Show and Parade. The Code Enforcement Division has been diligently handling several violations and citizen complaints, which is a testament to our commitment to serving the community. This division, along with supervisors from our department, has also been actively participating in weekly collaboration meetings with Development Services and ESD #1, further strengthening our ties with the community.

We are thrilled to announce that we have begun receiving new radios and additional equipment for the radio system, a significant milestone that was approved for purchase in this fiscal year's budget. Our team has already started working on programming and other necessary tasks for the transition to the new radio system. Once complete, this system will revolutionize our communication and interoperability capabilities, paving the way for a more efficient and effective department.

Additionally, this month, Officer Quick, the department's School Resource Officer, attended conferences and training to enhance his skills and prepare for the upcoming school year. Also, in collaboration with the Lago Vista Independent School District and ESD #1, several of our team participated in a tabletop emergency management exercise. This exercise went well and allowed everyone to collaboratively review emergency plans and familiarize themselves with the procedures of everyone involved in the exercise.

We also took advantage of several opportunities to interact with our community, including team members visiting the local Taekwondo Academy during their summer program and the Lago Vista Intermediate School during their "Jump Start" program.






Calls for Service – Historical and Year-to-Date




Calls for Service – 2024 by Month


Summary


Summary

Additionally, we respond to customer complaints of potential Code violations and initiate fair and unbiased enforcement actions to correct those violations and educate property owners to maintain code compliance.
