4. Map data is from the Lago Vista Police Department – Dispatch Division.




## Introduction

August was a busy and productive month for all divisions in the Police Department with a notable increase in our Calls for Service and incidents handled during the month. Our Code Enforcement Division has been working collaboratively with the ESD #1 Fire Marshall, as well as the City's Development Services and Public Works departments on several major code enforcement issues throughout the City. These can often be long processes but we are seeing progress made in several areas.

Noteworthy this month, all of our officers completed the Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training Active Shooter Response training. This training was mandated for all officers in the State of Texas to complete by August 31, 2025 and our department committed to having the training completed by the beginning of this school year. Chief Boshears and Sergeant Wilson are instructors for this program and we were able to train all of our officers locally instead of having to send them to outside training. Chief Boshears also attended the Texas Police Chief's Leadership Series training this month, a continuous education program that is mandated for all police chiefs in the state.

August was a great month for engaging with our community! Our officers made multiple visits to school as the school district began its year with support K9 Ella making some visits as well. We also held two community events during this month, a Smoothies with School Resource Officer and a 'Pop-Up Police Department' event, both hosted at local businesses and both going well. We also held our second planning meeting for our upcoming Citizen's Police Academy to work out details of this program which will offer an inside look at how the police department operates.

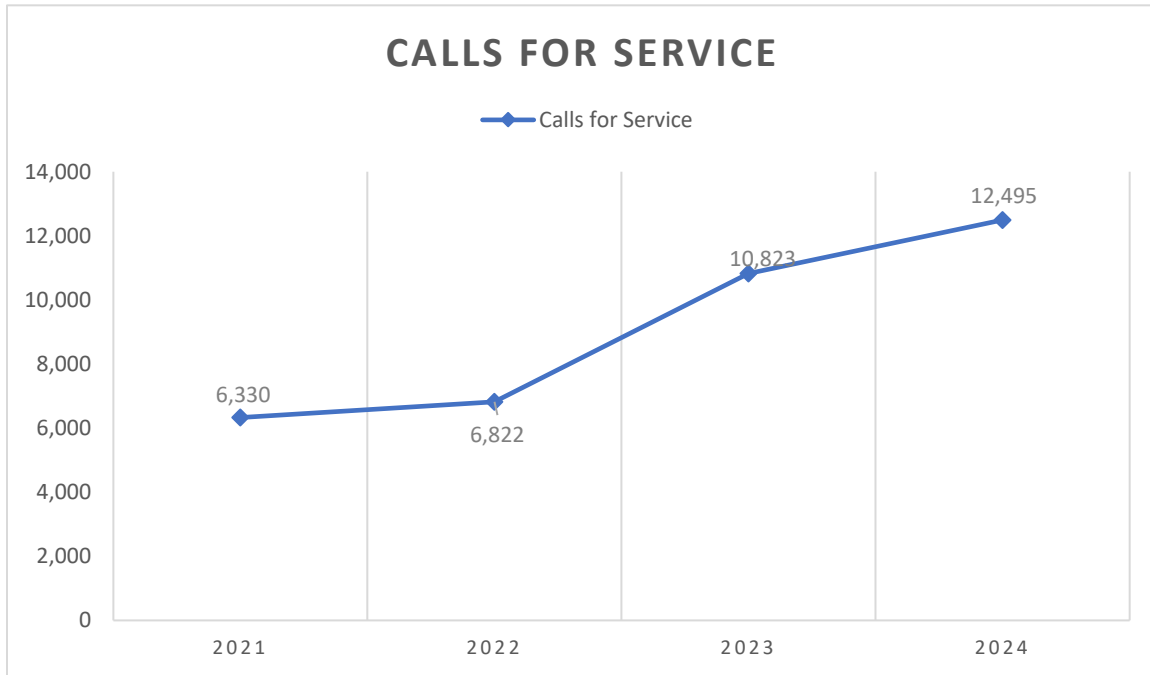

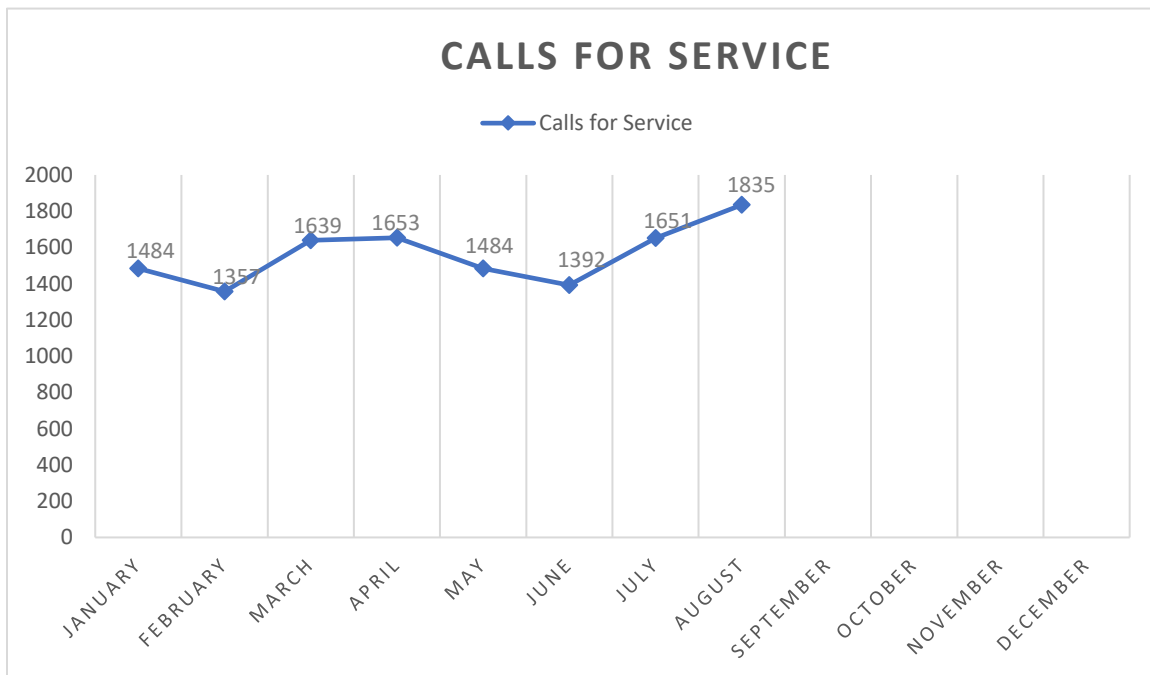

## Calls for Service – Historical and Year-to-Date



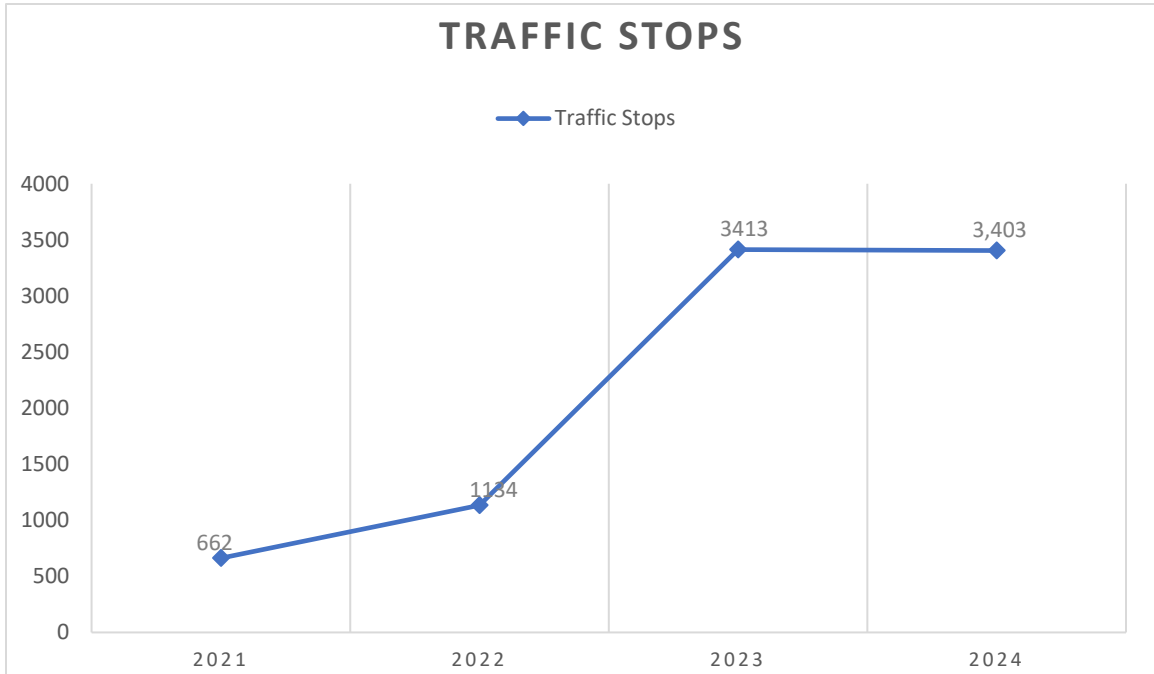
## Calls for Service – 2024 by Month



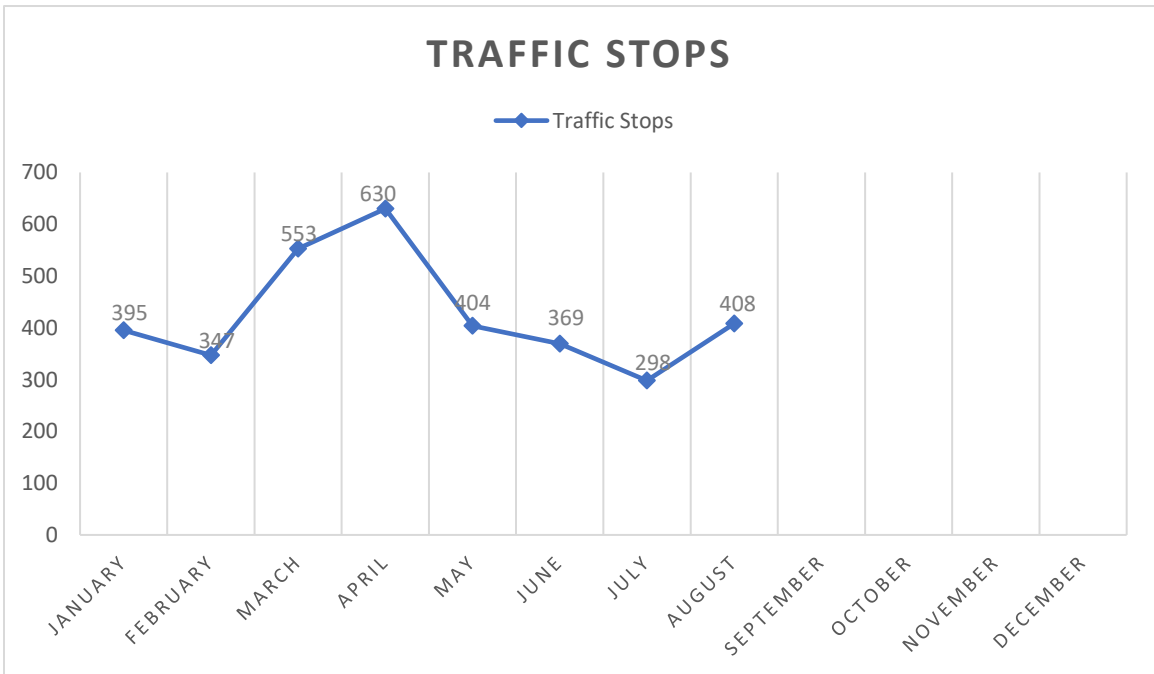
## Traffic Stops - Historical & Year-To-Date

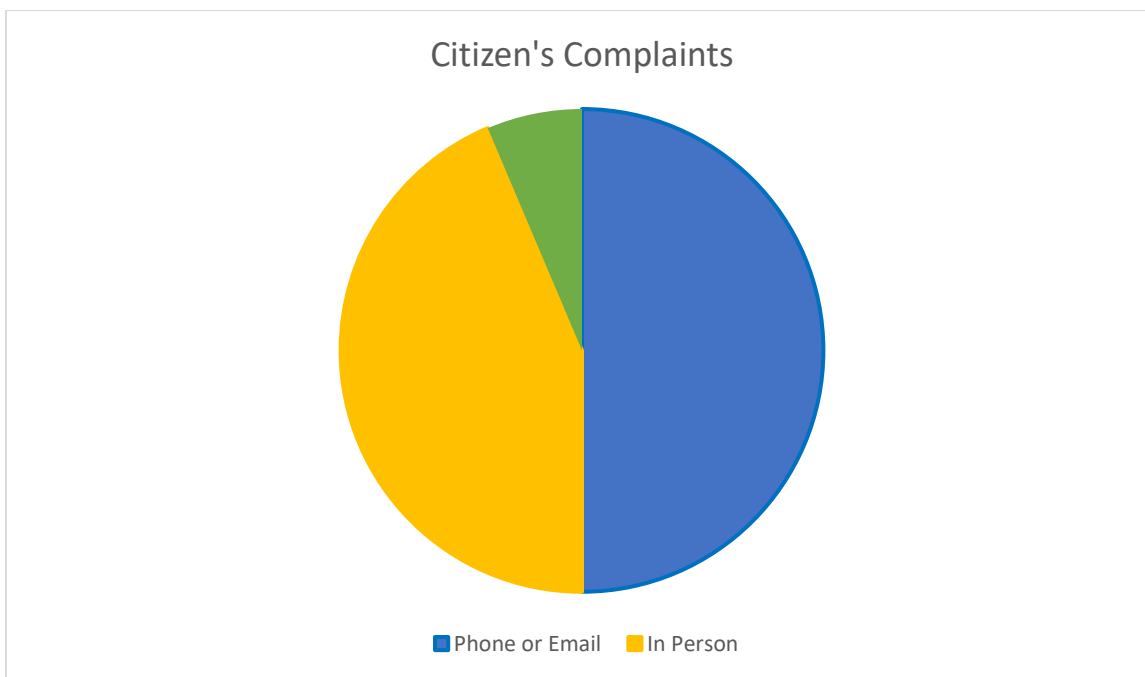
## Summary

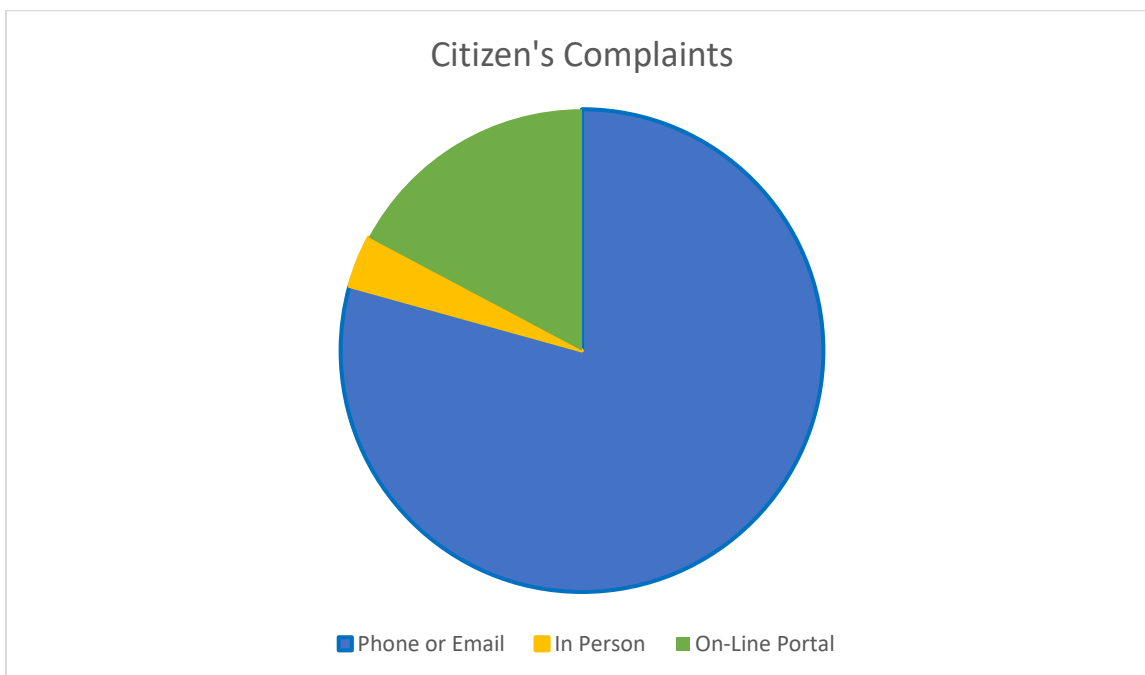
## Summary

Code Enforcement is a section of our Police Department that helps maintain and improve the quality of Lago Vista's neighborhoods by operating programs that ensure public compliance with the City Building Code and other state construction codes. Additionally, we respond to customer complaints of potential code violations, initiate fair and unbiased enforcement actions to correct those violations, and educate property owners on maintaining code compliance.
